APMG Global Assembly compositon

1. Global Media Authority

- **Function**: Oversees the integrity of information dissemination, ensuring media channels are used ethically to promote peace, accurate reporting, and education about APMG's mission.
- **Responsibilities**: Regulate APMG-affiliated media content, fight misinformation, and ensure access to factual information globally.
- Key Units: Global Communications Division, Media Ethics Committee, Public Awareness Campaign Unit.

2. Global Human Development Authority

- Function: Responsible for shaping policies and programs that foster human development, education, healthcare, and social equity across APMG's operational regions.
- **Responsibilities**: Drive global education initiatives, healthcare services, social justice programs, and human capacity development.
- Key Units: Education & Training Unit, Global Health Initiative, Gender Equality
 & Social Inclusion Division.

3. Global Legal Authority

- **Function**: Handles the global legal framework within APMG, ensuring compliance with international law and guiding internal legal disputes.
- o **Responsibilities**: Oversee human rights protections, mediate legal disputes, and ensure peace-building operations align with international laws.
- Key Units: International Law Council, Human Rights Compliance Division, Global Arbitration Committee.

4. Global Economic Research Authority

- Function: Conducts economic research to support global peace efforts by identifying and addressing economic inequalities, conflict causes, and development opportunities.
- **Responsibilities**: Analyze global economic trends, support sustainable development programs, and offer economic advice to all divisions.
- Key Units: Global Development Economics Office, Peace Economy Research Unit, Sustainability and Innovation Office.

5. Global Finance and Accounting Authority

- **Function**: Manages the financial resources of APMG, ensuring accountability, transparency, and efficiency in resource allocation and funding.
- **Responsibilities**: Oversee budgets, financial reports, grants, and resource allocation; manage funding for international programs.
- Key Units: Budget Office, Global Donor Coordination Division, Financial Reporting and Transparency Unit.

6. Global Security Research Authority

- **Function**: Provides expertise and research on global security threats and helps shape APMG's peacekeeping missions and security programs.
- **Responsibilities**: Address global conflicts, provide security assessments, and offer recommendations on peacekeeping operations.

 Key Units: Conflict Research Division, Global Security Strategy Office, Peacekeeping & Counterterrorism Advisory Board.

7. Global Scientific Analysis Authority

- **Function**: Guides scientific and technological research to support APMG's global initiatives, including conflict resolution, climate action, and health programs.
- **Responsibilities**: Promote scientific research in areas that directly affect global security and development.
- Key Units: Climate Action and Research Unit, Health Science Innovation Office, Technological Development Task Force.

8. Global Democracy & Governance Research Authority

- **Function**: Ensures that democratic principles and good governance are upheld within APMG and the regions it serves.
- o **Responsibilities**: Promote democratic governance, anti-corruption programs, and electoral reforms across APMG-affiliated regions.
- Key Units: Global Electoral Commission, Governance Reform Advisory, Anti-Corruption & Integrity Office.

9. Global Audit Authority

- **Function**: Provides an independent audit function to ensure transparency and accountability in all APMG's operations and programs.
- o **Responsibilities**: Conduct internal and external audits, ensure compliance with international best practices, and report on financial and operational performance.
- Key Units: Internal Audit Unit, External Audit Review Committee, Compliance and Ethics Office.

Governance Hierarchy:

- Global Assembly: The highest decision-making body that includes representatives from each authority, convening to make policy decisions for global peace, conflict resolution, and development initiatives.
- Executive Council: A select group from the Global Assembly responsible for implementing decisions, overseeing day-to-day global operations, and ensuring coordination between all authorities.
